Use of Play in Healing Children Trauma:

CREATES & OASIS Model



Introduction

Play therapy has been developed for decades in treatment of children emotional and behavioural problems.

However, most practitioners merely fix to rigid procedures and skills in one specific approach in the process of interventions.

Instead, searching the core element in use of play and apply to actual practice flexibly according to individual child needs and conditions.

Very often core element in use of play such as attachment need, emotional attunement and social conditions are neglect in clinical practice.

In addition, the natures of child traumas such as avoidance, trigger, dissociation and rebounce are not fully considered.

Finally, the use of play is restricted to individual play therapy sessions within play room rather than linking therapy to natural social environment in terms of games, tournament and interest development.

Professor Kam Shing YIP, after four decades of clinical mental health including many years experience in working with families with psychological and physical abuse, has developed a psychosocial model CREATES & OASIS in healing children with various forms of traumas.

The model has successfully trained and applied to hundreds of children in families with various forms of abuse and traumas.

It combines all core element in use of play to children in both clinical settings and natural social environment.
